The Death of Evangelism

In the Second Century, Christianity became entangled in theological controversy. The Third century saw a strong growth of apostasy. The Fourth Century made that apostasy complete. Christianity was then plunged into 1,000 years of darkness.

Under the leadership of Martin Luther, Christianity began to move out of this darkness. But, the Reformation of the 1500's was limited in scope. This was primarily theological reformation, a return to the examination of the Word of God. The writings of Luther drew the battle lines of the Reformation. The subjects he wrote about and discussed set the boundaries of Biblical exploration for a long time. But Luther left many aspects of Christianity untouched.


Luther said little about the second coming, the resurrection of the dead and the judgement. It was 300 years after Luther before these subjects came under study. Luther said little or nothing about missions and the evangelization of the world. It was left to William Carey in the 1790's to bring this New Testament ministry back to the forefront. The Holy Ghost received little attention in the Reformation. It has been only in the 20th century that the doctrine and place of the Holy Ghost

has been brought back into the church.

The period since the reformation has been a groping back to New Testament concepts. We have not yet bridged the gap. There may be other New Testament ideas, concepts and doctrines that we have yet to discover. In the new Testament there were two very definite, predominant types of evangelization - mass evangelism and personal evangelism. By the Third Century, both were largely lost. Incredible as it seems, there was no real return to evangelism until just 200 years ago. At that time, one kind of evangelism made its reappearance. This came through the ministry of John Wesley. We must thank John Wesley for bringing back mass evangelism.

Unfortunately personal evangelism has not yet made its re-entry into Christian History. Mass Evangelism made a dramatic reappearance with Wesley. We can hope and pray that personal evangelism will also blossom again. Personal evangelism is talked about, wrote about, preached about, and few people will do it. Dear God give us a day when the Church will hit the streets once again, talking about Jesus and winning the lost from door to door.

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ARTICLES of FAITH

The object for which it is formed is: To preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and promote a better understanding among all brethren.

We believe the Church of Jesus Christ to be a living Organism. The Body of Christ, and habitation of God through the Spirit (Ephesians 2:20-22), and that each true believer is a member of the Body (1 Corinthians 12:14; Acts 2:47).

Greetings, dear friends and readers of the Holiness Messenger. Bro. Parks and I put much of our lives into this work and the Messenger is now reaching more people than ever. Thanks for you support.

We believe in Holiness, sanctity and separation from the world. These three things are all one and the same. If you love the world, you aren't holy and you aren't sanctified. You are not a saint. There is no place in the Bible where we are told not to be holy. Holiness is the only doctrine (teaching) of the Word of God. The world (that is, that part of society that is apart from God and opposed to God) is separate from the saints. The saints aren't part of it and it is not part of the saints.

So how does a person become a saint? First, they must be born again. In John 3:3 Jesus said "Ye must be born again." The born again person is now a saint. This is the general term for all Christians – Saints. After you become a saint, then you must crucify, or put to death, the flesh and the old man. We received this old man, this fallen nature from Adam and Eve when they are beguiled by Satan.

Some men want to excuse their sin. They do so by claiming that everything is a sin and so their favorite sins are not that bad. A hypocrite in Texas once told me that the Bible said, "The thought of foolishness is sin," therefore, he claimed, we sin all the time. But the hypocrite forgot to keep reading. The next verse says, "He that deviseth to do evil shall be called a mischievous person." So the foolishness that the Bible is talking about there is the foolishness of

desiring evil. This man had committed an error common to those who try to wrest the Word of God. He tried to interpret the scripture in isolation from the verses around it. This is how many a foolish doctrine has been supported.

Whenever we begin talking about holiness, someone will reply, "You can't Judge." That is right, we can't. A Judge passes sentence and we can't do that. It's not our place to punish people for their sins. God has already taken care of that. He's already pronounced the sentence. "The Wages of Sin is Death." So that's not in our hands.

And just as God told us of the wages of sin, he also told us of the life of the Saints. John 3:2 says, "Beloved now are we the Sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." "And every man," the Bible goes on to say, "that hath this hope in him, purifieth himself. Even as he is pure."

The French philosopher and mathematician Blaise Pascal helped invent the hydraulic motor. Look at all the powerful mountain moving, coal mining, weight lifting feats that are done by these machines. But Pascal understood more than machines, he said. "The Christian religion is the only religion that is worthwhile, because it fulfills prophecy and no other religion can do that."

The great French statesman, Alexis de Toqueville, came to America to study our way of life. In his book "Democracy in America", he said that he looked for the greatness of America in the Universities and in the Colleges, but he could not find the answer there. Then he went into the churches of America and heard the preaching and found the Answer. "America," said de Toqueville, is great because it is good (righteous). When America ceases to be good, it will cease to be great."

It is up to you to decide, but as for me, I want to be like Joshua. "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

THE PIONEER OF BURMA

Adoniram Judson, the renowned missionary to India, Burma, etc., has an interesting story.

At the age of sixteen he formed an intimacy with a young man, who was engaged in amusements of a questionable kind, and before deciding on his future course in life left home with the intention of making a tour through some of the northern states of his native land. Before setting out he had told his father of his infidel sentiments, and had been severely condemned by him. His father's arguments he could repel, but his mother's tears and warnings, appealing to a nature, though proud, still tender and susceptible, made an impression which it was impossible to shake off.

"I am in no danger," he thought to himself. "I am only seeing the world — the dark side of it, as well as the bright; and I have too much self-respect to do anything mean or vicious."

Happily for Judson, at this critical period he stopped at a country

inn. The landlord mentioned, as he lighted him to his room, that he had been obliged to place him next door to a young man who was exceedingly ill, probably in a dying state, but he hoped that it would occasion him no uneasiness. Judson assured him that, beyond pity for the poor sick man, he should have no feeling whatever, and that now, having heard of the circumstance, his pity would not, of course, be increased by the nearness of the object. But it was, nevertheless, a very restless night. Sounds came from the sick chamber — sometimes the movements of the watchers, sometimes the groans of the sufferer; but it was not these which disturbed him. He thought of what the landlord had said — the stranger was probably in a dying state; and was he prepared? Alone, and in the dead of night, he felt a blush of shame steal over him at the question, for it proved the shallowness of his philosophy.

Hello once again. I have enjoyed writing these letters to you. I have been out of school for too long, so this was different for me. I would like to thank my brother Devin for proof reading my letter's before I sent them; also I want to thank Brother Parks for the opportunity to write. This is my final letter. Once again we are discussing the topic of Temptation. Let's visit the garden one last time to draw some more truths about temptation.

So paradise had a tempter in it. Then one thing is quite certain—go wherever we want to in this world, we cannot get away from temptation. Do you wish it wasn't so? Do you think life would have been better if there had been no possibility to sin? Do you think it was unfair to place a tempting tree in the midst of the garden?

In the garden we see Adam and Eve are given the power to sin. Without the power to sin we would not be men. The power of sin is horrible, but without the power to sin we would only be a machine. We have been given a will, the power to choose, God has given us trust. God could have created us without a will, and given us no choices to make, causing us to blindly obey instinct, like an animated machine. With no will man would not have fallen. However with no will, we would only be puppets in the hand of the puppeteer. The Bible records these words about Moses, "choosing rather

to suffer," the time came when Moses CHOSE what he would rather be, and so it is with us, we are choosing what we would rather be. We choose the clothes we would rather wear, the music we would rather listen to, and the life we would rather live. We live in a world of choices, which will determine our eternity.

We also see innocence in the garden. Innocence is not a virtue until it has been introduced to temptation and had opportunity to sin; then innocence is strengthened by resistance and exalted by victory. The power to sin implies the power to fall. Earth stands in the middle of heaven and hell; the only way upward is by overcoming temptation; the only way downward is by yielding to temptation.

There are only two ways you can deal with temptation. You can yield to temptation or you can resist temptation. If we have no resistance in the physical it is often a sign of sickness and weakness. The same is true in the area of temptation, when our resistance is down we are weak and sickly. When we hear the hiss of the serpent we must realize it is our opportunity to overcome. Temptation overcome is the only way to the throne of God. The brave men of the past believed that when an enemy was conquered the strength of the enemy went into the conqueror, increasing his strength. That is the way God makes his heroes, by overcoming temptation we are strengthened by each victory. If we will count the devil as our greatest enemy we can overcome the evil of our day. If we lived in a world without temptations, there could be no decisions; if there is no opportunity to sin, there is no opportunity for victory.

In the first temptation we see the fall and the consequences of the fall. Paradise is lost; the angel stands with flaming sword guarding against anyone returning to the beautiful garden. From this we learn that paradise and innocence are easier to keep than to recover once they are lost. There are some temptations, once yielded to, the consequences are

irreversible. Innocence cannot be recovered, the damage cannot be undone, and so prevention is our greatest cure. I feel our duty as parents and as a church is to be here for the return of all prodigals, however it is also our duty to prevent some prodigals.

You do not have to become a tragedy. You can make good choices and one day enter a city that will be greater than the first paradise. There will be no more temptation, no more possibility of sin, and you will have eternal life.

There was a serpent in Paradise, be for certain there are many in this wilderness. However, the Love of God is the greatest force in the universe; you have met it and resisted it. You are surrounded by an atmosphere of prayer, and must leap over the wall of restraints of home, and must loose yourselves from the hold of holy examples; it is harder for you to go to hell than to go to heaven. We hear the hiss of the serpent just as Eve did, but not everyone has handled the hiss of the serpent like she did. When honorable Joseph heard the hiss he fled and left his coat in the hand of a wicked woman. Paul wrote to Timothy and said, "Flee also youthful lusts," there are times when running away is your only way to safety, I would rather run than stay and fall.

To sum things up, the heart of the issue is an issue of the heart. If the heart is not healthy you will not and cannot make the right choices. The heart is deceitful above all things; our prayer must be God create within me a clean heart. Joseph made right choices because in his heart he had labeled the deed, in Genesis 39:9 he asks Potiphar's wife "how then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?" Joseph knew the deed was evil, and it was a sin against God. May God grant you the grace and give you a heart that will say no to temptation.

phy. What would the clear-minded intellectual, witty friend (the talented, but deistical young man alluded to before) say to such weakness? But still his thoughts would revert to the sick man. Was he a Christian, calm and strong in the hope of a glorious immortality, or was he shuddering upon the brink of a dark, unknown future?

"Perhaps he was a 'free-thinker,' educated by Christian parents and prayed over by a Christian mother. The landlord had described him as a young man; and in imagination he was forced to place himself upon the dying bed, though he strove with all his might against it. As soon as he had risen he went in search of the landlord, and inquired for his fellow-lodger. 'He is dead,' was the reply. 'Dead!' 'Yes, he is gone, poor fellow!' 'Do you know who he was?' 'Oh, yes; it was a young man from Providence College — a very fine fellow, his name was E_____."

Judson was completely stunned — it was his atheistic friend! After hours had passed, he knew not how, he attempted to pursue his journey. But one single thought occupied his mind; and the words, 'Dead!' 'Lost!' 'Lost!' were continually ringing in his ears. He knew the religion of the Bible to be true; he felt its truth, and he was in despair. In this state of mind he resolved to abandon his scheme of traveling, and at once turned his horse's head towards Plymouth.

From that hour his life, outwardly and inwardly, became changed. All his plans for the future were reversed. The dreams of literary distinction were renounced, and the one great question which he put to himself now was, "How shall I so order my future being as best to please God?"

The tale of his hardships, shipwrecks, imprisonments, and persecutions would make angels weep. Yet he murmured not. He translated the whole Bible into Burmese, and was buried at sea in 1850.

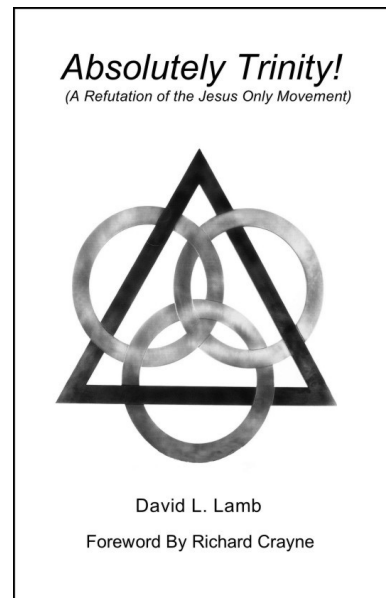

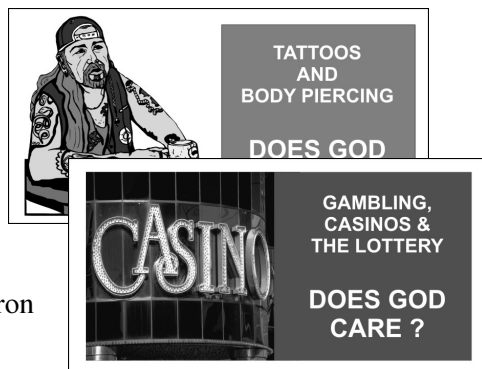
